A warm welcome to Ghent for the 34th ADMA annual meeting.

Ghent (Dutch: Gent; French: Gand; historically known as Gaunt in English) is a city and a municipality in the Flemish Region of Belgium. It is the capital and largest city of the East Flanders province, and the third largest in the country, after Brussels and Antwerp. It is a port and university city.

The city originally started as a settlement at the confluence of the Rivers Scheldt and Leie and in the Late Middle Ages became one of the largest and richest cities of northern Europe, with some 50,000 people in 1300. After the late 16th century Ghent became a less important city, resulting in an extremely well-preserved historic centre, that now makes Ghent an important destination of tourism.

The municipality comprises the city of Ghent proper and the surrounding suburbs of Afsnee, Desteldonk, Drongen, Gentbrugge, Ledeberg, Mariakerke, Mendonk, Oostakker, Sint-



Amandsberg, Sint-Denijs-Westrem, Sint-Kruis-Winkel, Wondelgem and Zwijnaarde. With 262,219 inhabitants at the beginning of 2019, Ghent is Belgium's second largest municipality by number of inhabitants. The metropolitan area, including the outer commuter zone, covers an area of 1,205 km2 (465 sq mi) and had a total population of 560,522 as of 1 January 2018, which ranks it as the fourth most populous in Belgium.

The ten-day-long Ghent Festival (Gentse Feesten) is held every year and attended by about 1–1.5 million visitors.

During the conference, you will stay at the NH Gent Belfort Hotel in Ghent (see next page).

1. Flights and transport

* By train:

If you prefer to take the train, Eurostar runs a service from London St Pancras to Brussels ('Brussel-Zuid' station). From Brussels you can travel onwards by train to Ghent ('Gent-Sint-Pieters' station), and the journey by direct train takes around 30 minutes. See www.eurostar.com

There is no direct train from Amsterdam Centraal to Ghent ('Gent-Sint-Pieters' station); however the trip is possible with a single transfer in Antwerp. See www.ns.nl

* By plane:

You can fly to Brussels airport (www.brusselsairport.be/en/passengers) with various airlines. From Brussels airport you can travel to Ghent ('Gent-Sint-Pieters' station) by train (the trip takes a little over an hour on average). You will find the train station in Brussels Airport directly under the Departure and Arrival Halls of the airport (level -1). The escalator or lift will take you directly to the platform (or into the airport). Upon arrival at the Gent-Sint-Pieters station you can travel onwards by taxi to the hotel NH Gent Belfort, the trip takes 15 minutes. Taxis are parked just outside the main entrance of the train station.

* By car:

The hotel has an underground carparking available for guests. It is NOT possible to reserve in advance. The front of the hotel is located in a restricted area ('Hoogpoort'), but the hotel parking is accessible via the back of the hotel ('Onderstraat'). The area is a "Low Emission Zone". Foreign cars must register before arrival. See the hotel website for more info. The parking fee is 27,50 Euro per day (to be paid at the hotel).



2. Accommodation: NH Gent Belfort



Accommodation is widely available at "NH Gent Belfort", which is also the location of the scientific meeting. The NH Gent Belfort hotel puts leisure travellers right in the heart of the city. A 5-minute walk takes you to sights like the cathedral, castle and belfry, plus you've got all the bars and restaurants you need just outside the door.

If you would like to extend your stay at "NH Gent Belfort"*, please contact the hotel directly to reserve a room for any extra night (e.g. Sunday); please mention that you are part of the ADMA party when booking.

* Please note that our group booking rates will not extend to further nights, which may cost extra.

Important:

There is a limited amount of 40 (!) rooms available. <u>First come, first served!</u> If there are no more rooms available, when you register, you will have to book your own accommodation. There are plenty hotels in the neighbourhood, the organisation will not facilitate this service for you. So, register as soon as possible but no later than March 1, 2024.



7. Ghent

The Belgian city of Ghent is the second largest city in Flanders. It offers a unique combination of an intimate city and the openness of a metropolis to its 264,000-plus inhabitants. With its 78,000 students, Ghent is the largest student city in Flanders and it is still growing.

The Lonely Planet travel guide labelled Ghent as "Belgium's best-kept secret". The city boasts



a number of UNESCO World Heritages Sites, an array of museums and art galleries, the works of which range from Hieronymus Bosch and Peter Paul Rubens to Andy Warhol and Joseph Beuys. And let's not forget The Ghent Altarpiece, or 'The Adoration of the Mystic Lamb' by the Van Eyck brothers. This very large and complex 15th-century polyptych in St Bavo's Cathedral is recognised as one of the most influential paintings ever made.

With its car-free centre and 400km of cycle paths, the city combines tourism with sustainability. A key cultural event in the calendar is the 10-day Ghent Festival, which attracts some 2 million visitors a year.
